## A) to replace a letter

## B) to indicate possession:

- 1) That is John's book. (That is "the book of John".)
- 2) That is the teacher's chair. (That is the chair where the teacher sits.)

NB There is something SPECIAL about the apostrophe used this way!

- 1) That's the boy's book. (There is only ONE boy.)
- 2) That 's the boys' room. (There is MORE THAN ONE boy.)
