When Elvis died on August 16, 1977 he was by no means broke, but his estate at Graceland was costing far too much to maintain. Priscilla received a lot of suggestions from friends, some of whom had been financial advisors to Elvis. The suggestions, none of which felt right to Priscilla, involved selling off Graceland. Instead, Priscilla decided to open Graceland to the public. Today, Graceland welcomes over 600,000 visitors a year, the great majority of whom come from outside of the city. They bring 150 million per year into the economy of Memphis. The rooms, all of which are included in the tour, have been left as they were in 1977. Also, Elvis' personal answers: costumes, wardrobe, awards are on view on the Graceland tour. His cars, most of which were Cadillacs, can be seen in the garage. Elvis loved Cadillacs, one of which was his favorite - a 1955 pink and white Fleetwood.

A museum across the street displays Elvis' planes. Elvis, **one of whose** planes was named Lisa, never actually learned to fly. More projects, **some of which** include expansion, are planned in the area surrounding the Graceland Mansion. Today, Lisa Marie Presley owns 100% of Graceland Estate. EPE (Elvis Presley Enterprises) manages licensing and sales of Elvis' products, **many of which** are available on their website. In 2005, several EPE shares were sold by Lisa Marie Presley, **the majority of whose** shares were bought by an entertainment company CKX, Inc.
